- ► HSAP High School Assessment Program (Exit Exam)
  - ► Graduation Requirement 2004-2014
    - ►BSAP Basic Skills Assessment Program
      - **1990-2003**
      - First Exit Exam
  - Class of 2015 will no longer be required to pass HSAP to receive a South Carolina High School Diploma
    - ► Section 59-18-310 SC Code of Laws
      - Act 155 of 2014 (H3919)

- Section 59-18-310 of the South Carolina Code of Laws
  - State Certificate Recipients
    - Earned all 24 units required for a South Carolina Diploma
    - ▶ Did not meet the Exit Exam Requirement
  - Petition local school board to determine eligibility to receive a high school diploma
    - ▶ Petition deadline: December 31, 2015
  - School Board will transmit diploma requests to the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDOE)
  - SCDOE currently developing procedures

#### Assessment Update: WorkKeys

- Developed by ACT: ACT WorkKeys
- ▶ Job skills assessment system that helps employers select, hire, train, develop, and retain a high-performance workforce
- Measures foundational and soft skills
- Twelve individual assessments
- Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information can lead to earning ACT's National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC)
- Administered to <u>all</u> first time 11<sup>th</sup> graders in 2014-2015
  - Section 59-18-325
- SCDOE negotiating contract and administration procedures

## Assessment Update: Smarter Balanced

- **H.**3893
  - ► Unanimously passed senate May 6, 2014
  - Removes SC from:
    - ▶ The Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium
    - Smarter Balanced Assessment
  - Prevents SC from administering Smarter Balanced Assessment

## Assessment Update: Grade11

- Section 59-18-325
  - First time eleventh graders in 2014-15 must be administered a College and Career Readiness Assessment (CCRA)
    - Required by the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act and by Title 1 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act
  - ▶ Will not be an "Exit Exam" assessment at this time

- Continues WorkKeys and College and Career Readiness Assessment in grade 11
- Outlines requirements for a summative assessment for grades 3-8, 11 and 9-10 if funds allow
- Executive Director of the Budget and Control Board will handle procurement for all assessments
  - ► Must be procured by September 30, 2014
  - Must be administered in 2014-15

- Neither the South Carolina Department of Education nor the SC Education Oversight Committee will approve the assessments
- A special panel will approve all assessments
  - Chairman of the State Board of Education
  - Chairman of the Education Oversight Committee
  - Chairman of the Board of Directors for the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce
  - Chairman of the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education
  - Chairman of the South Carolina Technical College System Board
  - State Superintendent of Education

- Outlines Summative Assessment Format for grades 3-8
  - Includes 9-10 if funds available
  - ► 2014-15 Paper and pencil format
  - ≥2015-16 Paper and pencil or computer
  - ≥2016-17 Computer for all students

- SCPASS
  - Formerly PASS Palmetto Assessment of State Standards
  - Science and Social Studies
    - All students in grades 3-8 will take both assessments in 2014-15
    - Only students in grades 4 and 7 take both assessments in 2013-14 and prior years

## Accountability Update: H.3893

- Assessments administered in 2014-15 and 2015-16 cannot be used to calculate school and district report cards ratings
- Report cards will be issued displaying results only
- Education Oversight Committee (EOC) will recommend one accountability system by fall 2016
  - ► Will meet federal and state reporting requirements

## Standards Update: H.3893

- Continued implementation of Common Core State Standards in ELA and Math in 2014-15
- CC ELA and Math Standards must be reviewed on or before January 1, 2015
  - Review will include extensive stakeholder input
- ► From the review, South Carolina College and Career Readiness Standards must be adopted for 2015-2016 implementation

## H3893 Implications

- ESEA Flexibility Waiver (Elementary and Secondary Education Act) requires:
  - College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS)
  - Assessment that measures CCRS
  - ► Teacher/Principal evaluation system that includes student achievement as one factor
- Without waiver approval for 2014-15, South Carolina returns to No Child Left Behind Status
  - ► Almost 100% of SC Title 1 schools would go into "improvement" status in 2014-15
- > 2014-15 ESEA Waiver for South Carolina is pending


- Components
  - ▶ Teacher's Professional Performance
  - ▶ Teacher's Impact on Student Learning Growth
    - Individual Student Growth
    - ► Teacher Value-Added (TVA)
      - ► Classroom Value-Added (CVA)
  - Overall growth of students in the school
    - School Value-Added (SVA)
- ▶ Used in personnel decisions in 2016-17

- Individual Student Growth (35% of teachers in SC)
  - ► TVA/CVA Teacher/Classroom Value-Added Component
  - State tested grades and subjects
  - ► Grades 4-5
  - ► Middle school (6-8) ELA and math teachers
  - ▶ 4th and 7th grade science and social studies; 5th, 6th, and 8th science or social studies (4th − 8th science and social studies)
  - High school teachers who teach a subject with an End-of-Course exam (currently Biology 1, Algebra 1, English 1, and US History)
  - 9th, 10th and 11th grade teachers of ELA and Algebra, Probability and Statistics, and Geometry

- School Value-Added (SVA)
  - Elementary & Middle Schools
    - ► Growth rating on available state-level assessments
  - ► High Schools
    - ► End-of-Course examination performance
    - ► HSAP first attempt passing rate
      - ► CCRA College & Career Ready Assessment
    - ► Graduation rate (on-time, and 5-year)

- ► Family (Community) Input
  - Parent and/or student surveys, etc.
  - ▶ Districts can opt to incorporate or not
  - ▶ If district omits the Family Input measure, then individual student growth (TVA/CVA) counts more


## **Proposed Teacher Evaluation System**



- ▶ Teachers in Non-Testing Grades & Subjects
  - ▶ 65% of teachers in South Carolina
  - Will not have individual student growth scores
  - ▶ Will use Student Learning Objectives (SLO)
  - Includes media specialist, guidance counselors, and school psychologists

- Student Learning Objectives (SLO)
  - Academic goal set by the teacher at the beginning of the year/course for all students or a sub-group of students
  - Specific, measurable, aligned to standards and/or district priorities
  - Educators scores based upon the degree to which the goals were attained
  - ► Teachers' detailed SLO data will reside in district
    - > Yes (met SLO) or No (not met SLO) will be reported to SCDOE

# **Proposed Teacher Evaluation System**



- Teacher Effectiveness Ratings
  - > 5 Levels
    - Exemplary
    - Highly Effective
    - Proficient
    - ► Needs Improvement
    - Ineffective
  - ► Effectiveness Ratings will not be shared with the public

## H3893 Implications

- SC Department of Education must submit a plan for approval to the State Board of Education to mitigate the impact that assessment changes may have on teacher evaluation systems
- If impact can be reasonably mitigated by delaying evaluations, then the SCDOE will seek a federal waiver if necessary
