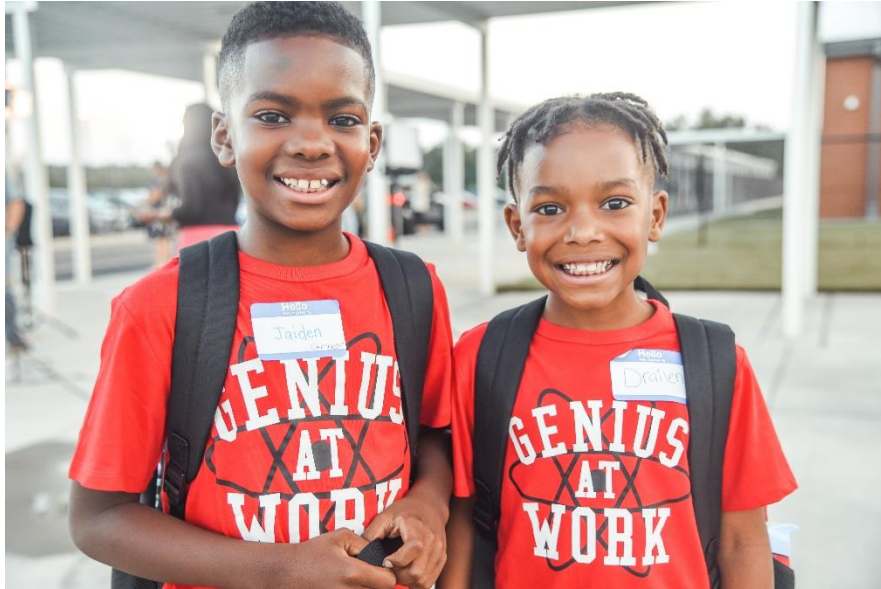

District Five: By The Numbers



STUDENT ENROLLMENT

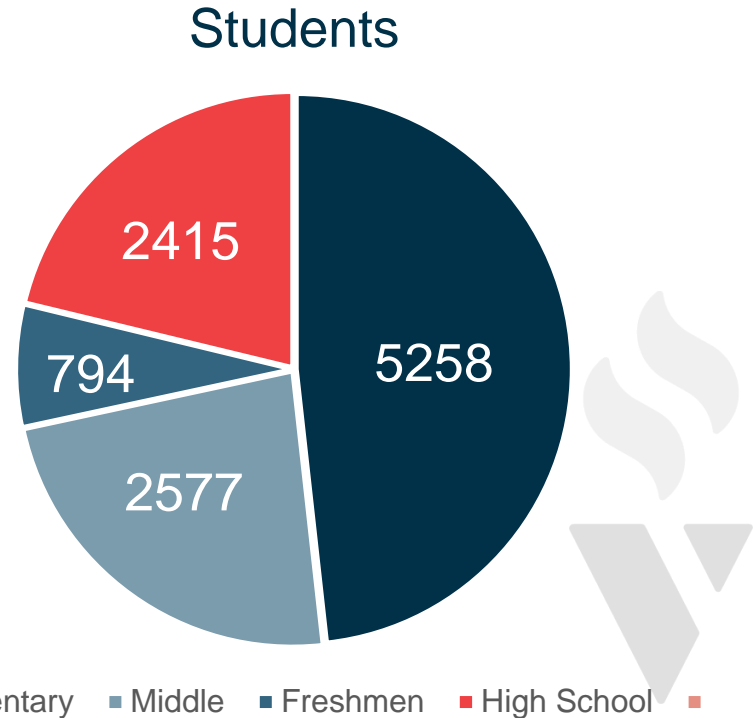
- 11,082 students
- Increase of 433 students from start of 2023-24 school year, or approximately 4%



District Five: Student Enrollment



- Enrollment includes 1324 students who are brand new to District Five
- This year's students come from families who speak 43 different languages, other than English



District Five: Staff Members



- 1842 total staff members (full and part-time)
- 242 new employees (new and part-time)
- 36 Induction teachers

TRANSPORTATION

- Currently transporting approximately 5,625 students a day, or approximately 50.3%

- 44 state owned buses, and 24 District Five buses
- 53 drivers, 5 additional in training
- 227 routes per day, 25,120 miles driven per week

FOOD SERVICE

- 19,200 breakfast + 48,925 lunch meals
- 68,125 TOTAL meals
- CEP program makes meals FREE for all elementary school students

First Week: Successes



- All four new schools/buildings were completed and opened up on time.
- Teachers and staff were moved successfully into new and existing schools, following major grade structure re-alliignment and staffing changes
- Custodial crews began and completed the stripping and waxing of floors in buildings across the district. This included the replacement of hallway floors at River Ridge and Beech Springs



First Week: Successes



- Transportation transitioned to a new routing system, which separated elementary students from middle & high school, providing a safer environment for our youngest students
- Despite attendance zone changes, the district did not see or experience any major issues with students being transported or showing up at the wrong school



First Week: Challenges



- Staffing needs remain in various schools and departments, specifically in food service, custodial services and transportation
- The district's growth has not slowed down, and the added population could present future challenges in terms of space and staff at some schools
