
Celebrating success in College & Career Readiness and Graduation Rate at Byrnes High School

Driven by VISION: *"James F. Byrnes High School will pursue exemplary educational opportunities and academic excellence in order to improve the quality of life for our students and community.*"

Goal 1: College and career readiness and achievement of students in grades 9-12 will continuously improve, as indicated by formative and summative assessment data and other quantitative measures.

How to earn College & Career **Readiness?** (CCR) Meet one Criteria

College-Ready:

- ACT composite score of 20 or higher
- SAT total score of 1020 or higher
- AP (Advanced Placement) Exam score of 3 or higher
- "C" or higher in at least 6 credit hours of approved Dual Enrollment courses

How to earn College & Career **Readiness?** (CCR) Meet <u>one</u> Criteria

Career-Ready:

- CTE completer AND earns a national industry credential or a state industry credential
- WIN SC Career Ready Test (SCRT) with a Level 3 Credential or above
- 31 or higher on the ASVAB
- Complete a state-approved work-based learning experience including successful exit evaluation from an employer
- Successful completion the SC High School Employability Credential (as defined in students' IEP)

BIG College & Career Ready Gains:

College Ready: 28.4% to 32.9% (+4.5) **Career Ready:** 52.1% to 75.5% (+23.4) **College AND Career Ready:** 22.4% to 32.2% (+9.8)

BHS in ACTION: College-Ready

- SAT/ACT test-prep mini-sessions during FLEX
- SAT/ACT workshops (full-day sessions)
- SAT/ACT test-prep via Progress Learning
- Increased enrollment in AP courses: 216 to 269 students
- Increased number of AP Exams: <u>309 to 383</u>
- Increased students scoring 3 or higher on AP Exams: <u>79% to 84%</u>
- Increased partnership with SCC, USC Upstate, Embry Riddle, and Limestone for more Dual Enrollment opportunities
- Increased Dual Enrollment by <u>99</u> total enrollments from 22-23 to 23-24

BHS in ACTION: Career-Ready

- WIN test-prep via Progress Learning
- Re-test identified students in WIN (2 additional opportunities during senior year)
- Clearly identified industry credentials and assessments for each pathway–defined course-taking patterns at BHS, RDA, MSC
- Intentional course scheduling (Study Hall, Early Graduation, etc.)
- Increase the number of students taking the ASVAB by strategically targeting specific courses
- Increased CTE completers: <u>196 to 216 students</u>
- Increased students earning a national or state credential: <u>231 to 270</u>
- Defined data entry process in PowerSchool for industry credentials with the Registrar

BHS in ACTION: CCR

- Expand business partnerships in the community, which leads to additional WBL opportunities for students
- Align WBL opportunities to Career Clusters
- Educate ALL stakeholders (teachers, counselors, students, parents) on CCR through professional development and print and visual communication
- Provide incentives for students who earn CCR
- Developed a system to monitor each students' progress toward earning CCR

BHS in ACTION: Grad Rate

- Utilize content recovery via Edgenuity to prevent failures
- Provide focused support for students in alternate placements including Rebel Academy (Online Learning coordinator)
- Defined entry/withdraw process in PowerSchool with the Registrar, which led to accurate record-keeping of transfers
- Emphasis on structured system of support by Graduation Coach including regular meetings and home visits
- Use of FLEX TIME and FlexTime Manager for accountability
- Continued use of Rebel Success Center, Attendance Recapture and mentor programs to provide academic support
- Included work-training opportunities for students during the school day (i.e. Operation Workforce Training)
