INDEPENDENT LEARNING TIME

Providing opportunities at both Byrnes High School and Byrnes Freshman Academy

Proposed for school year 2017-2018

What is Independent Learning Time? What is Structured Learning Time?

ILT

- time during the school day
- students choose activities or academic assistance
- self-directed
- allows for enrichment

SLT

- time during the school day
- students are assigned tutoring, make-up work, extra help
- prescribed, based on performance
- allows for remediation



Bell schedule would allow either ILT or SLT or both in all academic subjects, based on unique needs of each student.



Purpose & Benefits:

Improving student achievement and increasing graduation rate by...

- Strengthening student/teacher RELATIONSHIPS.
- Making school resources available to all students-media center, nurse, school counselors, bookkeeper, etc.
- Providing time for tutoring during the school day.
- Empowering students to take ownership of their learning (Independent Learning Time) while holding students accountable (Structured Learning Time).
- Increasing connectivity to school through access to clubs, intra-mural, and wellness activities.
- Creating opportunities for work-based, service-learning projects.
- Allowing flexibility for various events, without interrupting protected instructional time.

Roles during ILT/SLT

Teachers

- 30-minute unencumbered lunch
- Scheduled supervision/duties
- Set "office hours" for student interaction:
 - tutoring and extra help
 - make up work
 - enrichment activities
 - club meetings
 - intra-mural and wellness activities

Students

- Move with a purpose in supervised areas throughout the building
- Eat in designated areas outside of the cafeteria (will have multiple choices)
- Engage in Independent Learning Time (ILT)
 - Students select learning opportunities as needed.
- Engage in Structured Learning Time (SLT)
 - Scheduled attendance based on academic performance (less than 70 average).
- Participate in clubs, intra-mural and wellness activities as desired
- Complete virtual assignments (Schoology) using 1:1 devices.

- Supervision: This will be a duty for one half of ILT. The other half will be used for the faculty member's lunch.
- Tutor A: The faculty member will tutor for the first half of ILT. The second half is that faculty member's lunch.
- Tutor B: The faculty member will tutor for the second half of ILT. The first half is that faculty member's lunch.
- Select: These days are when faculty members may choose between department activities, club meetings, or any other student-centered enrichment activity the faculty member chooses. These are not to be used for anything that doesn't involve students (department meetings, etc.)
- Flex: These days the faculty member has the option of tutoring either A or B. It is their choice, but it's also their responsibility to communicate that to their students. It may change week to week, if they so choose.
- Intramurals: The faculty member will supervise the athletic activities during this time either in the auxiliary gym or the soccer field. For our first year, we will have "pick-up" style games rather than formal teams and tournaments.
