# STUDENT ENROLLMENT


- 10,339 students
- Increase of 377 students from 2021-22, or 3.7%



#### **District Five: Student Enrollment**



- Enrollment includes 1493 students who are brand new to District Five
- This year's students come from families who speak 31 different languages, other than English

- 1494 total staff members (full and part-time)
- 161 new employees this year!
- 45 Induction teachers

- 46 state owned buses, and two D5 buses
- 46 licensed drivers and STILL HIRING
- 166 routes per day, 20,000+ miles driven per week
