1. Call to Order and Notice to Media: Mr. Rick Eitel, Chairman, called the meeting to order and read the Notice to Media:

a) November School Board Election Update: Mr. Eitel informed the Board that Mr. Proper (5-3) and Mr. Cleveland (5-1) had enough petitions certified to be on November's ballot. Mrs. Gergley (5-2) did not have enough qualified signatures. Mr. Thompson (5-3) is not running for re-election. There were three petitions picked up, but not submitted to County Elections. Dr. Gary reported that Henry Laye, Director of Registration and Elections, indicated that the Board would need to appoint someone to fill Mr. Thompson's and Mrs. Gergley's seat.

Mr. Eitel reminded the Board of the process that was used in the past for similar situations. Most recently, Steve Brockman was named by the Board when his seat was open and no petitions were submitted. Prior to that, the Board accepted

applications from interested candidates, held a community forum for them to speak to the Board, and they selected the new Board member. This process was used to name Mrs. Gergley (2017) and Mr. Thompson (2010) to fill unexpired terms.

Mr. Eitel said that the Board would formally discuss the issue and make a final decision in their September meeting. The plan will be implemented in October, prior to the November election.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously (8-0) to move into Executive Session for the purpose of Personnel.
